Enabling Modern Authentication on an existing setup in Thunderbird.

Server Settings

- 1. Go to Account Settings
- 2. Go to Server Settings on the desired Mail Account
- 3. Set the Server Name to outlook.office365.com
- 4. Set the User Name to your mail Account
- 5. Change authentication method to: OAuth2.

Everything should look something like this:

- 7. Highlight the desired Server.
- 8. Press Edit
- 9. In the window, set the Server Name to: smtp.office365.com
- 10. In the window, set the User Name to your email account
